Dear Mr. Skiles:

It has been determined that the LexBlend Facility located in Nitro, Putnam County, WV is not defined, pursuant to 45CSR13, as a “stationary source.” This determination is based on the information in your Permit Determination Form (PDF) and associated electronic files submitted on February 20, 2015. This information indicates that the facility does not have a reasonably calculated maximum potential to discharge over two (2) lbs/hr OR five (5) tons/year of total Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs); six (6) lbs/hour AND ten (10) TPY or one hundred forty-four (144) pounds per calendar day of any regulated pollutant; or trigger a substantive requirement of any State or Federal air quality regulation.

Please be aware that any future changes to the facility may trigger the requirement to obtain a permit under 45CSR13 by defining the facility as a “stationary source.”
