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NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT AND HEARING

The West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is offering an opportunity for public comment, and will hold a public hearing, on the *Proposed Redesignation Request and Maintenance Plan for the West Virginia Portion of the Steubenville-Weirton, OH-WV 2006 PM_{2.5} Nonattainment Area*. The proposal concerns two inter-related actions regarding the West Virginia portion of the nonattainment area, comprising Brooke and Hancock Counties. First, DEP is requesting that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) redesignate the area to attainment pursuant to the provisions of the Clean Air Act, section 107. Second, DEP is asking that EPA concurrently approve, as a revision to the State Implementation Plan (SIP), the related maintenance plan which demonstrates that the area will continue to meet the PM_{2.5} air quality standards for at least ten more years. DEP is expressly soliciting comment on whether the currently proposed maintenance plan adequately meets the requirements of the Clean Air Act, section 175A, as well as any relevant comments regarding the incorporation of the finalized maintenance plan into the West Virginia SIP. DEP has previously proposed redesignation of the area with respect to the separate 1997 PM_{2.5} NAAQS. The comment period will begin April 13, 2012 and end on May 15, 2012.

The area was designated as nonattainment with the 2006 PM_{2.5} annual National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) in the November 13, 2009 Federal Register [74 FR 58688], effective December 14, 2009. On October 4, 2011, in accordance with Section 179(c)(1) of the CAA, EPA proposed to determine that the Steubenville-Weirton, OH-WV PM_{2.5} nonattainment area had attained the 2006 24-hour PM_{2.5} NAAQS [76FR61291]. DEP demonstrates that the measured air quality improvement has been achieved through federally enforceable emission reduction measures. Further, DEP shows that with expected growth and federally enforceable controls, the area will continue attainment of the NAAQS for at least ten years.

Written and oral comments will be accepted during the public hearing and will be made part of the formal record. The public hearing shall be held beginning at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 15, 2012 at DEP headquarters: 601 57th Street, SE, Charleston, WV 25304. Written comments will also be accepted for inclusion in the formal record by mail, facsimile (304-926-0479), e-mail (Tammy.L.Mowrer@wv.gov) or other delivery to the Division of Air Quality if received by the close of business on May 15, 2012.
