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## **Notice of Draft 2014 CAIR NO<sub>x</sub> Ozone Season Allowance Allocation Compliance Order and Public Comment Period**

The West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Air Quality (DAQ) proposes to issue a Clean Air Interstate Rule (CAIR) NO<sub>x</sub> Ozone Season Allowance Allocation Compliance Order. This Draft Compliance Order establishes the 2014 CAIR NO<sub>x</sub> Ozone Season allowance allocation for Unit 002 at the Axiall Corporation Natrium Plant (WV ID# 051-00002) located in New Martinsville, West Virginia. Unit 002 is subject to the standard requirements and provisions of 45CSR40, *Control of Ozone Season Nitrogen Oxides Emissions*, and the CAIR NO<sub>x</sub> Ozone Season program administered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The CAIR Designated Representative for the Axiall Corporation Natrium Plant is Mr. J. Thomas Horan; 15696 Energy Road, State Route 2, Proctor, WV 26055.

One CAIR NO<sub>x</sub> Ozone Season allowance authorizes the unit to emit one ton of nitrogen oxides during an ozone season, which is May 1 through September 30. By April 1, 2014, the Director will establish and allocate CAIR NO<sub>x</sub> Ozone Season allowances to Axiall Corporation Unit 002 by Order in accordance with the NO<sub>x</sub> allowance allocation provisions of 45CSR§40-43.

In accordance with 45CSR§40-43.4, the Director has determined the 2014 CAIR NO<sub>x</sub> Ozone Season allowance allocation for Axiall Corporation Unit 002 equals 359 tons. This allocation was calculated using the unit's 2013 ozone season heat input of 691,152 mmBTU, multiplied by the boiler's baseline NO<sub>x</sub> emission rate of 1.04 lb/mmBTU, divided by 2000 lb/ton and rounded to the nearest whole number of NO<sub>x</sub> allowances (in tons).

Beginning January 31, 2014, the draft 2014 CAIR NO<sub>x</sub> Ozone Season Allowance Allocation Compliance Order may be viewed between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. at the Division of Air Quality's Northern Panhandle Regional Office, 131A Peninsula Street, Wheeling, WV 26003 and at the Division of Air Quality main office, 601 57<sup>th</sup> SE, Charleston, WV 25304. In accordance with 45CSR§40-43.3.b, this notice makes available to the public the 2014 CAIR NO<sub>x</sub> Ozone Season allowance allocation determined under 45CSR§40-43.3.a, and provides an opportunity for submission of objections to the determination. Such objections shall be limited to addressing whether the determination is in accordance with 45CSR§40-43.4. Send written objections and any request for a public hearing to John A. Benedict, Director, Division of Air Quality at the

above Charleston address. Please identify the draft document to which the objection applies, the commenter's name, address, and telephone number. Any person who requests a public hearing should identify any substantive issue they intend to raise in a hearing. If the Director finds that a public hearing will clarify any such substantive issue affecting the draft 2014 CAIR NOx Ozone Season Allowance Allocation Compliance Order, a public hearing will be announced in a timely manner.

Written objections regarding the draft 2014 CAIR NOx Ozone Season Allowance Allocation Compliance Order must be received by the DAQ by March 3, 2014, before 5:00 p.m. Objections submitted by U.S. Mail must be postmarked by March 3, 2014.
