

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is announcing an opportunity for public comment on a proposed *West Virginia State Implementation Plan revision for Clean Air Act §§110(a)(2)(E)(ii) and 128 Requirements*. The State Implementation Plan (SIP) is the plan developed by West Virginia in order to fulfill certain responsibilities under the Clean Air Act. A public hearing will take place beginning at 6 p.m. on September 15, 2014 in the Dolly Sods Conference Room at the DEP headquarters. The public comment period will begin on August 15, 2014 and end at the conclusion of the public hearing on September 15, 2014.

This proposed SIP revision demonstrates West Virginia's mechanism to comply with this Clean Air Act "infrastructure" element. DEP is seeking comments on whether the document adequately demonstrates West Virginia's compliance with the pertinent federal Clean Air Act mandates related to this State Implementation Plan infrastructure element.

Upon completion of the public notice period, and after addressing any written or verbal comments, the DEP will submit the final documentation to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as a revision to the SIP.
