**CONSENT ORDER  
ISSUED UNDER THE

**INTRODUCTION**

This Consent Order is issued by the Director of the Division of Water and Waste Management (hereinafter "Director"), under the authority of West Virginia Code, Chapter 22, Article 11, Section 1 et seq. to Vincent Concrete, Inc (hereinafter "Vincent Concrete").

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

In support of this Order, the Director hereby finds the following:

1. Vincent Concrete operates an industrial facility located in Shinnston, Harrison County, West Virginia. Vincent Concrete was issued WV/NPDES Water Pollution Control Permit No. WV0111457, Registration No. WVG611368 on May 30, 2008. Said registration expired on September 30, 2009.
2. Establishments with discharges composed entirely of stormwater associated with industrial activities must obtain a permit from the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection (WVDEP) pursuant to §22-11-8 of the State Code of West Virginia and as described in Legislative Rule Title 47, Series 10.
3. WVDEP advised Vincent Concrete in mid-2009, early -2010, and January 2011 to reapply for permit registration coverage under the Multi-Sector General WV/NPDES Water Pollution Control Permit for Stormwater Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity.

4. On February 9, 2011, Vincent Concrete's permit was reissued.
5. On June 25, 2011, Vincent Concrete submitted a letter to WVDEP concerning the renewal of its permit.

### **ORDER FOR COMPLIANCE**

Now, therefore, in accordance with Chapter 22, Article 11, Section 1 et seq. of the West Virginia Code, it is hereby agreed between the parties, and ORDERED by the Director:

1. Vincent Concrete shall immediately take all measures to initiate compliance with all pertinent laws and rules.
2. Within forty-five (45) days of entry of this Order, Vincent Concrete shall submit an administratively complete application for permit coverage for the regulated activity. This application shall be submitted to:

3. Because of Vincent Concrete's West Virginia Code violations, Vincent Concrete shall be assessed a civil administrative penalty of four thousand eight hundred seventy dollars (\$4,870) to be paid to the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection for deposit in the Water Quality Management Fund within thirty (30) days of entry of this Order. Payments made pursuant to this paragraph are not tax-deductible for purposes of State or federal law. **Payment shall be mailed to:**

### **OTHER PROVISIONS**

1. Vincent Concrete hereby waives its right to appeal this Order under the provisions of Chapter 22, Article 11, Section 21 of the Code of West Virginia. Under this Order, Vincent Concrete agrees to take all actions required by the terms and conditions of this Order and consents to and will not contest the Director's jurisdiction regarding this Order. However, Vincent Concrete does not admit to any factual and legal determinations made by the Director and reserves all rights and defenses available regarding liability or responsibility in any proceedings regarding Vincent Concrete other than proceedings, administrative or civil, to enforce this Order.

2. The Director reserves the right to take further action if compliance with the terms and conditions of this Order does not adequately address the violations noted herein and reserves all rights and defenses which he may have pursuant to any legal authority, as well as the right to raise, as a basis for supporting such legal authority or defenses, facts other than those contained in the Findings of Fact.
3. If any event occurs which causes delay in the achievement of the requirements of this Order, Vincent Concrete shall have the burden of proving that the delay was caused by circumstances beyond its reasonable control which could not have been overcome by due diligence (i.e., force majeure). Force majeure shall not include delays caused or contributed to by the lack of sufficient funding. Within three (3) working days after Vincent Concrete becomes aware of such a delay, notification shall be provided to the Director/Chief Inspector and shall, within ten (10) working days of initial notification, submit a detailed written explanation of the anticipated length and cause of the delay, the measures taken and/or to be taken to prevent or minimize the delay, and a timetable by which Vincent Concrete intends to implement these measures. If the Director agrees that the delay has been or will be caused by circumstances beyond the reasonable *control* of Vincent Concrete (i.e., force majeure), the time for performance hereunder shall be extended for a period of time equal to the delay resulting from such circumstances. A force majeure amendment granted by the Director shall be considered a binding extension of this Order and of the requirements herein. The determination of the Director shall be final and not subject to appeal.
4. Compliance with the terms and conditions of this Order shall not in any way be construed as relieving Vincent Concrete of the obligation to comply with any applicable law, permit, other order, or any other requirement otherwise applicable. Violations of the terms and conditions of this Order may subject Vincent Concrete to additional penalties and injunctive relief in accordance with the applicable law.
5. The provisions of this Order are severable and should a court or board of competent jurisdiction declare any provisions to be invalid or unenforceable, all other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
6. This Order is binding on Vincent Concrete, its successors and assigns.

7. This Order shall terminate upon Vincent Concrete's notification of full compliance with the "Order for Compliance" and verification of this notification by WVDEP.
